North Carolina Learning Object Repository

The North Carolina Learning Object Repository (NCLOR) is a collaborative effort between the Community Colleges, UNC System, DPI, NC Virtual Public School, and Independent Colleges and Universities.

Does the NCLOR integrate with my institution's course management system?

The NCLOR integrates with Blackboard and Moodle course management systems. Although you can use the NCLOR without a CMS, the seamless integration makes it so faculty who want to add resources to their online course will not need a username and password to access the NCLOR. If faculty wish to contribute resources, they will need a username and password assigned to them by the NCLOR staff.



What is the purpose of the NCLOR?

The NCLOR collects documents, audio/video clips, simulations, learning modules, assessments, and more – virtually any type of learning resource that is designed for transference over the Internet. Teachers from around the state can then search the NCLOR, find resources appropriate to the classes they are teaching, and use them as is or modify them to suit their needs. This concept of sharing and reusing is the core of the NCLOR philosophy. Teachers can become more productive and can save a lot of time.

Course Ready Resources at Your Fingertips

Who can access the NCLOR?

Faculty and staff at an affiliated educational institution can obtain a login and use the resources within a CMS; however anyone can access the guest resources.

Are the learning objects available at no cost?

There is no cost for using the resources for affiliated educational institutions. All NCCCS colleges are affiliated institutions.

How are contributed works protected?

Contributors to the NCLOR are protected under copyright and Creative Commons licenses. However, any resource contributed to a collection is automatically shared with all of the members of that collection. Any resource that was not created by the contributor, not in the public domain of the Internet or the contributor does not have the permission of the resource creator to contribute the resource should **NOT** be placed into the NCLOR.
